Once her A-Levels are finished, Jennifer hopes to study mechanical engineering, but she said will still carry on honing her cooking skills whilst she embarks on her studies.

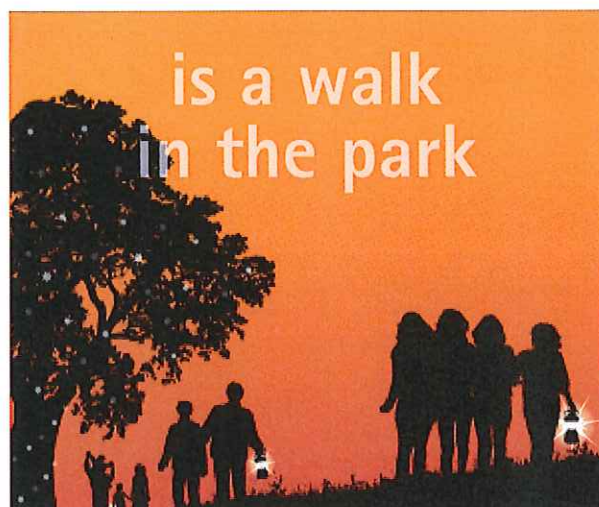
Scrummy World Cookbook will be officially launched this September at the Wilmslow and Deansgate branches of Waterstone's.
