Abbey College Manchester was founded in 1990 as part of the Alpha Plus Group of schools and colleges. Over the past thirty years the college has become one of the leading providers of independent sixth form education in Greater Manchester with over 200 students.

We aim to:

- guide our students to achieve academic success and fulfil their aspirations
- respect and value each student providing a friendly, safe, supportive environment where students are happy and grow in confidence
- show a sensitive understanding of the challenges facing young people in the 21st Century by empowering students to make informed decisions and have the determination to achieve their goals
- prepare our students for university, their future careers and to make a positive contribution to the community

We are a dynamic, exciting college, situated in the heart of Manchester providing high quality, flexible A-Level and GCSE programmes as well as courses aimed specifically at our international students. A new innovation in our curriculum has allowed us to design our unique Combined Studies Programme, which leads directly to university entrance. We also offer an Academic Studies with Football Training Programme, which is aimed at male and female students who are 14 years of age and over. Students study one of our main academic programmes each morning and have football training in the afternoons.

Our students enjoy the cultural, educational and business opportunities afforded by learning in the city centre. Our modern building provides an environment conducive to study and in our small classes each student can develop their individual aptitudes aided by a strong system of tutorial guidance.

Teaching and learning is rigorous whilst being creative and responsive to individual need.

Our enrichment activities include sport, arts, music and many other opportunities. We encourage students to raise their own expectations and standards to the highest possible level. Staff, students and families get to know each other well and enjoy working together. At Abbey College Manchester we offer a unique alternative to the traditional school whilst maintaining a strong academic ethos. Everyone contributes, everyone is appreciated; our committed teachers love their subjects and seek to inspire their students, in their turn, to love learning and value the acquisition of knowledge.

TEACHING & LEARNING

Small classes

We believe that small classes and high quality teaching are the key to success. This approach is very personal and means that students are focused on their studies and are given lots of attention from teachers to maximise attainment and fulfil potential. Class sizes are small and our normal maximum is twelve. Alongside small class sizes we foster a friendly environment by having a no uniform policy and creating relationships where everyone is on first name terms.

Expert teachers

Our dedicated teachers have an excellent knowledge of their subjects and the specifications and as examiners for the major examination boards they are well positioned to offer guidance and support in developing examination technique. Teachers break down subjects into manageable sections so that students can work more easily towards the grades they need. Students are prepared thoroughly for public examinations and gain important study skills.

Success in the Sixth Form

The new linear A-levels have created additional challenges for learners. Our Success in the Sixth Form Programme focuses on helping students study more effectively and to develop the necessary skills to become successful in their studies.

Studying in the college

All students have timetabled, supervised study built into their programmes. In our study centre students work quietly and this builds a culture of concentration and respect for the learning needs of others.

Assessment and monitoring progress

Small class sizes mean teachers can spend more time assessing each student's work and giving verbal and written feedback on a one to one basis. Teachers assess student effort and attainment regularly. Reports are sent home each half term and include written comments and data covering attendance, academic attainment and student effort both in the classroom and in their own time. Students and teachers reflect on current work and raise standards by agreeing targets in areas such as subject knowledge, time management, revision techniques and progress on coursework. This in turn builds confidence and raises standards.

Attendance

Attendance is monitored through daily registration and at the start of every lesson. Parents are contacted if a student is not present in class and are sent weekly attendance data.

THE 4RS AND SUCCESS IN THE SIXTH FORM

We use a framework called the **4Rs** to help students manage their learning and develop academic excellence:



Routine:

We guide students to manage their time effectively and have good study habits.

Rigour:

We develop students' academic skills and knowledge and challenge them as learners.

Responsibility:

We develop students so they can take control of their learning and respond to advice.

Resilience:

We build confidence and mental toughness so students can tackle exams with confidence

Our Success in the Sixth Form Programme supports students in developing the 4Rs and equips students in being able to make the transition to university.



THE COURSES WE OFFER

Making informed choices

Making the right decision about the study programme has a huge impact on successfully working towards the next stage in life and at Abbey College Manchester we value individual aspirations and ambition. Choosing the most appropriate programme is a very important part of the enrolment process and we offer expert guidance during the interview and throughout the student's time with us.

Two year A Level programme

We offer a range of A-level subjects covering the sciences, mathematics, business, economics, the arts and humanities. Entry is dependent on satisfactory GCSE grades, usually a 6 in the subjects or related subjects to be chosen, together with a good reference from the previous school.

Retake A Level programme

This is suitable for students who have studied A-levels before but wish to retake to improve their grades to get onto more competitive degree courses.

Students mostly focus on retaking Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics but other subjects can be considered as well.

Academic Studies with Football Training

GCSE, A-level or Combined Studies students may opt to combine their studies with football training delivered on three to five afternoons each week.

Combined Studies Programme

This is an alternative programme to A-levels and offers a wide range of pathways with direct access to degree courses at selected universities.

One year GCSE programme

The college offers a unique and highly successful one year GCSE programme for students who wish to transfer mid GCSE into year 11 or for students wishing to re-sit their GCSEs. The subjects offered form a core curriculum and the course is delivered in its entirety in a year.

House system

Each student belongs to one of our three houses and within this will have a personal tutor. Students will see their personal tutors everyday and for a longer session once a week, and is the person they approach if they have anything they wish to discuss. The Head of House is the first line of communication for parents and they run assemblies and inter-house competitions for the students.

Students, parents and teachers working together

We believe that the team approach is highly successful in ensuring that students achieve their potential. Communication between Heads of House and parents are integral to supporting the student's progress through the course and onto the next stage of their education.

Individual needs

Our lessons are lively and encourage students to discuss ideas, ask questions and to be involved in active learning. OUR FACILITIES

Well equipped classrooms


All our classrooms benefit from access to modern technologies including interactive touchscreen boards and laptops. All departments are equipped with specialist rooms and textbooks and notes are provided for all courses. Students have their own personal computer login and access to the student shared drive where the virtual leaning environment and teaching resources are stored.

Science laboratories

Practical work and investigation is central to the teaching of Biology, Chemistry and Physics, and so each subject is taught in five modern laboratories. Each room has been fitted to the highest standards and is well equipped to allow the delivery of a wide range of experiments and demonstrations to stimulate student learning.

Art and Photography suites

Creativity flourishes within the college with Art & Design and Photography taught in dedicated rooms. Students are encouraged to express themselves using techniques ranging from 3D modelling, textiles, sculpture and photography as well as conventional painting and drawing.



UNIVERSITY PREPARATION

Students receive support from our specialist University Support Team who guide them through the UCAS process and help build a competitive application.

Our comprehensive programme is designed to guide students through each stage of the UCAS process:

- An introduction to UK universities and the UCAS process
- Guidance in researching suitable universities and courses
- Specialist programmes and support for Oxbridge and competitive courses/universities

- Specialist Medical and Dental preparation programme
- Help with the UCAS application procedure
- Advice on writing an effective Personal Statement
- Support with finding relevant work experience
- Guidance on interview techniques through practice sessions
- Advice on reviewing offers and the best options



BOARDING

Sometimes students who join us live some distance from Manchester. Riverside House Student Accommodation offers high-quality, safe accommodation within a 15 minute walk of Abbey College Manchester, and Manchester City Centre. Students are able to stay in the accommodation for either seven days a week or if they prefer, five days each week returning home at weekends. The college has reserved an area, split over the top two floors of Riverside, with access restricted to our own students and staff. Riverside House has 24 hour Security on site, along with secure door entry system, and CCTV cameras. There is also secure cycle storage, laundry facilities, onsite maintenance team, and cleaning of kitchens completed weekly.



Please note: This option is only open to students who are aged 16 before the 1st September of the academic year in which they enrol. The accommodation at Riverside House is offered on a Full-Board basis, with ingredients being provided for the students to prepare their own breakfast and lunch. A home cooked evening meal is prepared everyday by our own on-site chef or students can opt to cook their own food.

Universities are looking for well-rounded applicants with broad interests and a range of "soft skills".


We offer a range of academic and non-academic enrichment activities to help students develop general life skills and broader interests and experience.

Being in the heart of the city centre, means the easiest, most convenient way of reaching us is by public transport.

We are about 10 minutes walk from Piccadilly, Victoria, Oxford Road and Deansgate railway stations. The free Metrolink shuttle bus number 1 that runs between each of these stations every 10 minutes or so does drop off and pick up on King Street opposite the college.

Piccadilly Gardens and Shudehill bus stations are within 5 minutes walk from the college with the tram stops of Market Street and St Peter's Square even closer.

Driving in is straightforward but please note that there are no on-site car parking facilities at the college. However, there is street parking available and there are several car parks within a few minutes walk of our front door.
